### CMS-HCC\_V28 Model Updates

This tip sheet is intended to assist providers and coding staff with the documentation and **ICD-10-CM selection, along with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Hierarchical Condition Category (HCC) Version 28 Model Updates**, on services submitted to Healthfirst—specifically for common types of **Angina**. It provides information from industry sources about proper coding practice. However, this document does not represent or guarantee that Healthfirst will cover and/or pay for the services outlined. Coverage decisions are based on the terms of the applicable evidence of coverage and the provider's participation agreement. This includes the determination of any amounts that Healthfirst or the member owes the provider.

### ICD-10-CM Codes and Descriptions

Under HCC V28 Model, these codes will no longer risk-adjust for DOS 2024	
I20.1	Angina pectoris with documented spasm
I20.2	Refractory angina pectoris
I20.8	Other forms of angina pectoris
I20.9	Angina pectoris, unspecified
I25.11*	Atherosclerotic heart disease of native coronary artery with angina pectoris

\*Sixth character identifies to 1 – with documented spasm, 2– with refractory angina pectoris, 8 – with other forms of angina pectoris, 9 – with unspecified angina pectoris

# Documentation and Coding

<b>I25.70*</b>	Atherosclerosis of coronary artery bypass graft(s), unspecified, with angina pectoris
<b>I25.71*</b>	Atherosclerosis of autologous vein coronary artery bypass graft(s) with angina pectoris
<b>I25.72*</b>	Atherosclerosis of autologous artery coronary artery bypass graft(s) with angina pectoris
<b>I25.73*</b>	Atherosclerosis of nonautologous biological coronary artery bypass graft(s) with angina pectoris
<b>I25.75*</b>	Atherosclerosis of native coronary artery of transplanted heart with angina pectoris
<b>I25.76*</b>	Atherosclerosis of bypass graft of coronary artery of transplanted heart with angina pectoris
<b>I25.79*</b>	Atherosclerosis of other coronary artery bypass graft(s) with angina pectoris

\*Sixth character identifies to 1 – with documented spasm, 2 – with refractory angina pectoris, 8 – with other forms of angina pectoris, 9 – with unspecified angina pectoris.

**If documented and supported, providers should use alternative ICD-10-CM codes within the category to specify the form of angina pectoris**

<b>I20.0</b>	Unstable angina
<b>I23.7</b>	Postinfarction angina
<b>I25.110</b>	Atherosclerotic heart disease of native coronary artery with unstable angina pectoris

<b>I25.700</b>	Atherosclerosis of coronary artery bypass graft(s), unspecified, with unstable angina pectoris
<b>I25.710</b>	Atherosclerosis of autologous vein coronary artery bypass graft(s) with unstable angina pectoris
<b>I25.720</b>	Atherosclerosis of autologous artery coronary artery bypass graft(s) with unstable angina pectoris
<b>I25.730</b>	Atherosclerosis of nonautologous biological coronary artery bypass graft(s) with unstable angina pectoris
<b>I25.750</b>	Atherosclerosis of native coronary artery of transplanted heart with unstable angina
<b>I25.760</b>	Atherosclerosis of bypass graft of coronary artery of transplanted heart with unstable angina
<b>I25.790</b>	Atherosclerosis of other coronary artery bypass graft(s) with unstable angina pectoris

# Documentation and Coding

## Documentation Should Include

Status of Condition	Specify Vessel	Symptoms	Link Associated Conditions	Treatment Plan
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Improved</li> <li>Worsening</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Native</li> <li>Autologous vein</li> <li>Bypass graft</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Occurs at rest</li> <li>Becomes more frequent, severe, or prolonged than the usual pattern</li> <li>Change from usual pattern</li> <li>No response to rest</li> </ul>	<p><b>By using verbiage:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Due to</li> <li>Associated with</li> <li>Secondary to i.e., atherosclerosis, history of MI, heart disease, etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Final diagnostic statement</li> <li>Diagnostic results with findings: EKG, echocardiography, or stress test confirming diagnosis of unstable angina</li> <li>Treatment options for unstable angina, including:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coronary angiography, coronary angioplasty, stent, or coronary artery bypass graft procedure, referrals</li> <li>Medications, i.e., Nitroglycerin, Heparin</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

## Coding Example

<b>Case</b>	Seventy-year-old female comes to emergency department (ED) with coronary artery disease (CAD) native artery with unstable angina; it is being treated with Nitrostat and Heparin injection.
<b>Rationale</b>	Assign <b>I25.110</b> – Atherosclerotic heart disease of native coronary artery with unstable angina pectoris; it is supported in V28 model. Documentation supports <b>higher specificity</b> for angina.
