ICD-10-CM Codes and Descriptions

ICD-10-CM	Description
J15 (HCC)	Bacterial pneumonia not elsewhere classified
J15.0	Pneumonia due to Klebsiella pneumoniae
J15.1	Pneumonia due to Pseudomonas
J15.20	Pneumonia due to staphylococcus, unspecified
J15.211	Pneumonia due to Methicillin susceptible Staphylococcus aureus
J15.212	Pneumonia due to Methicillin resistant Staphylococcus aureus
J15.29	Pneumonia due to other staphylococcus
J15.5	Pneumonia due to Escherichia coli
J15.6	Pneumonia due to other Gram-negative bacteria
J15.8	Pneumonia due to other specified bacteria

Pneumonia

Coding Example

Question	Does the instructional note providing sequencing guidance at code J44.0 , Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease with acute lower respiratory infection, apply also to ventilator-associated pneumonia?
	No, the instructional note "Use additional code to identify the infection," at code J44.0 does not apply to ventilator-associated pneumonia. The ICD-10-CM code for ventilator-associated pneumonia does not fall into the "respiratory infection" codes category. Code J95.851 , Ventilator-associated pneumonia, is under the section titled "Intraoperative and postprocedural complications and disorders of respiratory system, not elsewhere classified."
AHA Coding Clinic Rationale	Assign codes J44.9 , Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, unspecified, and J95.851 , Ventilator-associated pneumonia, for a patient with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and ventilator-associated pneumonia. Sequencing will depend on the circumstances of admission. For example, if the reason for admission is the ventilator-associated pneumonia, code J95.851 would be sequenced as principal diagnosis .
