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Artificial Opening

Artificial openings are surgically created through an incision to establish a passage between internal organs and the outside of the body.

Coding Tips

- Presence of an artificial opening without need for care codes are assigned to (Z93. *)
 category. The codes from this category should only be reported as secondary diagnoses.
- When documentation supports attention or management of artificial openings, the
 appropriate code for abstract should be from (Z43* Encounter for attention to artificial
 openings), category. These are not to be used together with (Z93. * Artificial openings
 status) codes.

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Coding Example

| Case 1 | Patient recently diagnosed with laryngeal cancer. Last week had a resection of tumor blocking his airway. Currently with tracheostomy. No complaints; here to discuss continuing chemotherapy and radiation. |
|-------------------------------|---|
| Correct Code Assignment | C32.9 Malignant neoplasm of larynx, unspecified Z93.0 Tracheostomy status |
| Comments | A status code Z93.0 Tracheostomy status should be used, along with the code to capture patient's current laryngeal cancer. When documentation does not specify aftercare, do not use Z43.0 , Encounter for attention to tracheostomy. |
