Chronic Post Rheumatic Arthropathy [Jaccoud]

This tip sheet is intended to assist providers and coding staff with the documentation and ICD-10-CM selection on services submitted to Healthfirst specifically for common types of **Chronic Post Rheumatic Arthropathy [Jaccoud]**. It provides information from industry sources about proper coding practice. However, this document does not represent or guarantee that Healthfirst will cover and/or pay for the services outlined. Chronic Post Rheumatic Arthropathy [Jaccoud] is a chronic, non-erosive joint deformity that is the result of severe or repeated bouts of rheumatic fever, which is caused by an infection with Group A beta-hemolytic streptococci. The deformities are reducible and typically correctable with manipulation.

Documentation Recommendations

Updated Status of Condition	 Currently on medication "x"; currently stable Worsening Improved
Identify location of Chronic post rheumatic arthropathy	 Shoulder Elbow Wrist Hand Hip Knee Ankle and Foot Other Specified Site Multiple Sites
Specify Laterality	RightLeft
Identify Risk Factors	 Rheumatic fever (untreated or poorly managed rheumatic fever increases risk) Age (risk increases with age) Genetic Predisposition
Diagnostic Tests	 Complete Blood Count (CBC) and Comprehensive Metabolic Panel (CMP) Rheumatoid factor (RF) Test and Antinuclear Antibody (ANA) Test Erythrocyte sedimentation rate and C-reactive protein Joint Fluid (synovial fluid) Test X-rays, Ultrasounds, computed tomography (CT), and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)
Treatment	 Physical therapy Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) Corticosteroids Immunosuppressants Orthotic Devices Surgery

Documentation and Coding

Coding Tips

- For chronic post rheumatic arthropathy [Jaccoud], vertebrae, use code M12.08.
- When chronic post rheumatic arthropathy has a specific location and laterality, use additional characters.
- Do not document a suspected or unconfirmed diagnosis as if it were confirmed.
- Do not use words that imply uncertainty ("likely," "probable," "apparently," "consistent with," etc.) to describe a current or confirmed diagnosis in the outpatient setting.

Coding Example

	A 38-yr-old female patient is seen for a follow up for chronic post rheumatic arthropathy of right hand. Previous medical history includes rheumatic fever. Clinical examination revealed painless reducible deformities of her right hand. Labs were negative for rheumatoid factor (RF) and antinuclear antibodies (ANA). Patient was referred to physical therapy.
Diagnosis Reported	M12.041, Chronic post rheumatic arthropathy [Jaccoud], right hand
