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Malignant Melanoma of Face

Malignant Melanoma of the Face, though not rare, is a critical condition that demands immediate medical care. Timely identification and intervention greatly enhance a favorable result. Melanoma may manifest as a new mole or alterations in a pre-existing one, typically exhibiting features such as asymmetry, irregular borders, multiple colors, a diameter exceeding 6mm, or modifications in size, shape, or color.

C34.31	Malignant melanoma of nose
C34.39	Malignant melanoma of other parts of face

Coding Tips

- Do not code Melanoma in situ (D03-D03.9) with category C43* Malignant melanoma of skin
- Histological Subtype (e.g., superficial, spreading, nodular, Lentigo maligna)
- Use appropriate TNM staging and metastasis codes if applicable (e.g., C79.XX for distant spread).
- When primary malignancy has been excised but further treatment, such as radiation therapy,
 chemotherapy or adjuvant therapy is directed to that site, the primary malignancy code should be used.
- When a primary malignancy has been previously excised or eradicated from its site and there is no further
 treatment directed to that site and there is no evidence of any existing primary malignancy at that site, a
 code **Z85.820** Personal history of malignant neoplasm of skin, should be used to indicate the former site
 of the malignancy.

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Coding Example

Case	A 59-year-old female presents to the dermatology clinic with a pigmented lesion on her left cheek . A biopsy confirms superficial spreading malignant melanoma with a Breslow dept of 1.2mm. The lesion is confined to the skin of the face with no evidence of regional lymph node involvement or distant metastasis. The dermatologist documents a final diagnosis of malignant melanoma of the face and recommends surgical removal via Mohs surgery.		
Diagnosis Reported	C43.39-Malignant melanoma of other parts of face		
Rationale	c43.39 is the correct ICD-10 code for Malignant melanoma of other parts of the fa when the specific site (e.g., cheek) is known but not separately classified (as opposed to nose).
